#### **Maintenance Work**

We have had a significant amount of work happening around the school over the last few weeks. Painting the covered walkway area and hall, new carpet and linoleum in the library, a new sink in K/1R, new wet area flooring in A and B block classrooms. This has freshened up some areas in our school. The staff and students have been very flexible during this time and the end results are most definitely worth it.

#### NAIDOC Open Day- Wednesday 26 June- 11.30am-3.00pm

NAIDOC stands for National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee. NAIDOC Week is held in the first full week of July. It is a time to celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander history, culture and achievements and is an opportunity to recognise the contributions that Indigenous Australians make to our country and our society. At Leonay PS all classes will be involved in a variety of activities on Wednesday 26 June. These include Aboriginal sport, stories, painting and music. We will also have a performance by the Nepean Creative and Performing Arts Aboriginal dance group. At 2pm the whole school will listen to Jason and Trevor from Dalmarri, who will present aboriginal stories and artefacts. Parents are most welcome to join us on the day from 11.30am onwards. Students are reminded that it is a mufti day and to dress in Aboriginal colours of red, black and yellow or Aboriginal shirts or clothing.

#### **Staff Professional Learning**

On Wednesday this week all Leonay PS teaching staff attended a 3 hour workshop titled 'Understanding Adversity: A brain-based approach to emotional and behavioural challenges.' We combined with the staff of Emu Plains PS and Emu Heights PS for the session. It focussed on the key areas on child development and trauma, child well-being and resilience and trauma informed practices in schools. The 3 hours of professional learning will count towards completing the Friday Staff Development day at the end of term 4. The workshop complements the aspects Mr Davies and his team are focussing on with student wellbeing.

#### **Before School Supervision**

The school supervision roster starts from 8.30am each morning. There is no staff available to ensure the safety of children in the playground prior to that time. Whatever arrangements are made, parents need to understand that they are legally responsible for their child prior to 8.30am when supervision begins. Please ensure that your child is not left unsupervised at school before 8.30am.

#### **School Carpark- Out of Bounds**

Due to safety concerns, please note that all carpark and driveway areas are out of bounds for both students and parents. I encourage all parents to walk safely on path areas both before school and in the afternoon, setting a positive example to their children. Please remember the Kiss and Drop rules for Fairways Ave. Parents and carers are able to legally drop off or pick up their children within a two-minute timeframe. Penrith Council rangers have been patrolling this area recently as a result of a number of complaints. Please adhere to the rules for the safety and welfare of our students and community. Last year, we began our involvement in the KidsMatter program which saw an increased emphasis on the mental health of our students and the introduction of Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) in class programs. KidsMatter has now merged with a number of other nation-wide organisations and now comes under the wider umbrella of Be You. In 2017, Beyond Blue was appointed by the Australian Government to lead Be You. They have drawn from a wide research and evidence base to create a framework that allows preschools, primary and high schools to support infants, children and young people to achieve their possible mental health.

**WE NEED YOUR HELP!** As part of the planning process, it is important that we get an accurate and representative snapshot of how well parents believe our school is currently supporting their child/ren in becoming happy, resilient, resourceful and connected young people.

Be You The Be You Family Survey is designed to help gather mental health and wellbeing-related perceptions of all parents and carers within our learning community. Responses gathered from parents and carers can help highlight what we are doing well, and what we can do better as part of our commitment to continuous improvement.

- This survey takes approximately 15 minutes to complete and includes 26 questions.
- Your responses are anonymous and only summarised results are used to help us better understand how to improve mental health and wellbeing in our learning community.
- Although not every question may seem relevant to you, please answer each honestly and as best you can. The term 'learning community and learning environment' refer to your child's school.
- If you have several children and/or young people attending the learning setting, please respond to questions from an overall perspective.
  The survey is not compulsory and you can skip questions if you want to.

## Drop-off and Pick-up zones Safety tips

#### Safety tips for drivers using a Drop-off and Pick-up zones

- Always drop off or pick up your child from the designated zone and follow the school's procedures.
- Drivers should remain in their vehicles at all times in the Drop-off and Pick-up zone.
- Make sure children use the Safety Door (the rear footpath side door) to get in and out of the car.
- · Make sure the handbrake is applied when the vehicle is stationery.
- Always park legally.
- Avoid dangerous manoeuvers such as U-turns and three-point turns.

#### Safety tips for students

- Always get in and out of the vehicle through the Safety Door, the rear footpathside door.
- Stay buckled up until the vehicle has stopped in the Drop-off and pick-up area.
- Make sure your school bag and other items are in a safe position, such as on the floor.
- Be ready to get out of the vehicle with your belongings when the car has stopped and you have unbuckled your seatbelt.

#### Safety tips for volunteers

- · For easy identification, wear a safety item, such as a fluoro vest, sash or hat.
- Remain on the footpath when helping students to exit and enter each vehicle, in turn, in the Pickup and Drop-off zone.
- Do not attempt to direct traffic and do not enter the road environment.
