## 2023 Kindergarten Enrolments and Orientation Program

At present we have 20 enrolments for Kindergarten next year, less than in previous years. It is not too late if you haven't enrolled yet. Please contact the office immediately.

Our plan for the Kindergarten Orientation program involves enrolment interviews being conducted in the week commencing 17 October and three onsite sessions on 8/11/22, 15/11/22 and 22/11/22 from 10am to 11am. More information will be communicated to families regarding these events.

#### **Solar Panels**

I just received word that Leonay PS have been selected to receive an initial Solar PV package in support of the Cooler Classrooms Project. This includes 20 panels that will be located on G Block (Year 3 and 4 classrooms). While the project has been officially signed off, I am unsure when work will begin.

#### **School Crossing Program**

The School Crossing Supervisor (SCS) program is a state-wide program that contributes to the safety of infants and primary school students. School crossing supervisors help students use the crossings on roads adjacent to or nearby schools.

Last year I put in a request for a SCS at the crossing facility on Leonay Parade, Leonay.

The crossing has been determined to meet the Transport for NSW criteria for the provision of a school crossing supervisor. The position will be advertised at the beginning of next term.

## Leonay Value - Show Pride in our School - School Uniform

Recently the staff have spoken to the children about what this looks like at Leonay PS. One of the areas discussed was school uniform. It is important that all students have the correct uniform each day. This includes the tunic, shorts or skirts for the girls (not the bike pants) and shorts or pants for the boys. The other area of concern is shoes and socks. All students need to wear black shoes or black joggers unless it is sports day. In term 4 all students will do sport on Friday. Socks need to be plain white, grey or black as part of uniform. School hats must be worn every day unless it is a designated mufti day. Zone representative shirts can be worn on Friday only. Please take some time to speak to your child about this. Coming dressed ready to be a learner shows pride in our school. The P and C run a second-hand uniform stall if you need to purchase any additional items.

# Kiss and Ride' on Fairway's Avenue and Road Safety

We've included the following information on how the 'Kiss and Ride' zone on Fairways Ave should work. **The 'Kiss and Ride' zone is simply an area on Fairway's Avenue to drop off and pick up students. It is unnecessary to park and get out of the car.** You should stop in the area, stay in your car, leave your engine running, and ensure that your child safely exits or enters on the kerb side of the car, then move off in a safe manner for all cars. If everyone follows this procedure then we'll avoid a build-up of traffic. Please do not drop off or pickup your child in the 'No Stopping' zone. Following these basic road rules helps to make our school a safer place for all. Rangers regularly patrol the area and issue hefty fines.

There has been a significant number of permission/payments not being received by the due date for a variety of school activities.
