NSW Public Schools Student Survey Information and opt-out form

Dear parents and carers

In Term 2, our school is taking part in the NSW Public Schools Student Survey. The survey is being conducted by the NSW Department of Education (the department) and invites students to provide valuable feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them.

The survey will allow the department to conduct analysis and research into student wellbeing and engagement to drive improvement for all NSW public schools.

What you need to know

- Participating students will be given a unique login to complete the survey online.
- Students will complete the survey at school during school hours. The survey will take approximately 10 to 15 minutes.
- Participating in the survey is voluntary. Opting not to participate will not impact your child's school experience. Your child can choose to stop the survey at any time and they can skip any questions that they prefer not to answer.
- More information about the survey and the research is available at <u>education.nsw.gov.au/npss</u>.

What information is collected and why

The department will collect personal information from your child including, but not limited to, information relating to their gender, cultural background, and their opinions on matters such as their school experience. Information will be held and managed by the NSW Department of Education, 105 Phillip Street, Parramatta NSW 2150. This information is collected to support every student to achieve their educational potential, and for other directly related purposes including but not limited to:

- implementing programs that meet student educational and support needs
- · maintaining the good order and management of schools
- assessing and evaluating the effectiveness of programs and their impact on student educational outcomes
- conducting lawful research and compiling statistics relating to the education and wellbeing of students and student performance
- operational and administrative purposes.

How the department may use the information

Survey results may be used locally at schools to help inform planning and decision-making. Your child's school will receive a report once surveys are completed, but school staff will not be able to identify individual students from their responses. At least 5 students need to have answered the question in the same way for that data to be included in the results.

The department's analysis of the data will involve linking students' responses to their student reference number (SRN). Responses may then be linked with other information the department may hold, such as students' scholastic year, gender, Aboriginal status, cultural background, migrant status and whether they are a person with a disability. This will allow the department to group the results for analysis and research purposes.

The department does not intend to give you a copy of your child's responses, or the opportunity to amend them. You may contact the department to request access to the survey responses, and your request will be considered in light of the department's obligations under law.

NSW Department of Education

On Monday 31 March (3-6 classes) and Monday 7 April (K-2 classes) Leonay were lucky to have Catherine from Keep Australia Beautiful visit to share knowledge and information about rubbish and it's impact on the environment. We talked about the rubbish that is produced just from the food that is included in our lunchboxes and the value of bringing as much nude food to school as possible. Here are what a few students had to say about the visit -





I learnt that some of our bottles can go in the yellow bin at school. Sam KK

I learnt that when we put some rubbish in the bin it goes to the dump, but we can stop rubbish going to the dump if we use the yellow bin for our bottles and sometimes you can go to return and earn. Alessia K/1D

I liked the recycling relay where we had to sort our rubbish into the right bins or lunchbox. Eden 1/2F

I learnt that rubbish goes in a hole and gets filled over with dirt and in a long time it disintegrates. We can help by using reusable things not plastic stuff, you can recycle by making art and if you have a plastic Ziplock bag you can reuse it another time. Georgia 2/3T

It made me feel sad when they said all the dumps are filling up and they are thinking about transporting the rubbish but I am hopeful that we can recycle a lot more rubbish than we would usually put in the waste bin like juice boxes. Asher 3/4R

I realised there's actually more than I thought that goes to landfill. We can help the environment by reducing plastic waste and having more containers that we reuse everyday. I liked the way that Catherine told us in a way that we are able to easily understand and she gave us interesting information. Ewan 4/5M

I learnt that it's not great for the environment to bring plastic lunch wrapping but instead it's better to have naked food. I enjoyed when we scored our lunchbox because I got a big score. Lewis 5/6W

I think it is good for kids to learn about what you put in the bin, that goes to landfill because they will just bury it and that leads to pollution in that area. We should share that we can recycle and use multiple-use items such as drink bottles and containers and that will reduce landfill. Ayden 5/6L
